WHAT IS THE CONSOLIDATED PLAN?

Every year, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) provides the City of Los Angeles federal grants that assist low-income communities and residents around the city. The funds have been used to assist businesses to create jobs; improve neighborhoods through projects that eliminate slum and blight; and provide affordable housing, domestic violence shelters, services for seniors, and fair housing services.

WHY ARE WE SEEKING YOUR FEEDBACK?

We need your opinions on how the federal funds should be spent for program year 46, starting July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021. Tell us what you think and help us develop a plan that is the best use of these grant funds.

WHAT IS THE STRATEGY FOR HOW THE FUNDS WILL BE USED?

Our strategy is to take advantage of the additional funds the City will receive for affordable housing and other community investments, combined with Consolidated Plan funds, to help make Los Angeles communities healthier and more livable. Your comments will help us determine what's most important to you and help us to design a plan that guides how we achieve that over the next few years.
