Gateway Connections



Gateway Connections reaches out to people on the streets, helps them move into permanent homes, and creates new units of permanent supportive housing throughout the Gateway Cities region.

The program is run by four partner organizations, under the leadership of **PATH Partners**.

Housing & Services

- Outreach services throughout the Gateway Cities region, targeting areas identified as homeless "hot spots" and engaging with the people living in them.
- Screenings and assessments to determine eligibility for services and housing programs.
- Case management, available to all individuals identified at hot spots. Case managers help clients prepare for permanent housing, by assisting with the receipt of identification documents, applying for benefits, accessing supportive services, and more.
- Emergency housing solutions, such as motel vouchers, while working with clients to move into permanent housing.
- Housing location services, to help clients find and secure a permanent home.
- Ongoing supportive services after the client moves into permanent housing.

Goal:

Serve 500 people living on the streets.





Housing Strategies

- Work with local landlords to identify available affordable units for clients.
- Identify resources and partners for the development of new units.

Goal:

Help 665 households move into permanent supportive housing by the end of 2017.
