











Specifically, the SSA needs to see through claimant's medical records that at least one of the following is true:



- Claimant experiences frequent or persistent bacterial, fungal, viral,

- Calimant experiences frequent or persistent bacterial, fungal, viral, or parasitic infections
 Developed cancer and that the cancer is advanced or terminal
 There is fluid collecting on the brain or brain swelling that causes severe disruption in claimant's ability to think or move effectively
 Calimant had severe weight loss (HIV-wasting syndrome)
 Uncontrolled and persistent diarrhea has required claimant to have IV fluids and nutrition via a feed tube for a month or longer
 Calimant experienced other types of infections (sinusitis, encephalitis, sepsis, etc.) that required hospitalization, IV therapy, or which are resistant to treatment
 Calimant's frequent infections and other complications have severely compromised activities of daily living (ADIs)
 If claimant is unable to meet or closely match the disability listing (in the Blue Book), then claimant will have to proceed through additional reviews to determine eligibility.
