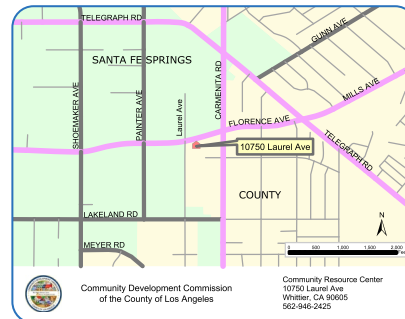

Family Programs

Information and Referral - The Community Resource Center (CRC) helps connect residents with services and programs to assist with a variety of needs such as counseling, healthcare, legal aid, education, and childcare.

Department of Public Social Services (DPSS) Programs -

Medi-Cal - A healthcare program that provides health, dental, and vision coverage.

CalFresh - Food benefits that help low-income families, individuals, and seniors purchase healthy and nutritious food. To make an appointment, call (562) 946-2425.

Central American Resource Center (CARECEN) - Provides weekly citizenship classes, confidential fee waivers for immigration applications, immigration and naturalization eligibility consultations, Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) eligibility and renewal, and naturalization form preparation assistance. To make an appointment, call (562) 946-2425.

Harriet Buhai Center for Family Law - Free legal assistance pertaining to custody, domestic violence, spousal support, visitation, child support, community property, establishment of paternity, and divorce. To make an appointment, call (562) 946-2425.

Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) - Utility payment assistance to eligible households to offset the costs of heating and/or cooling dwellings. To make an appointment, call (888) 351-4061.

Health Care Access - Certified Educators are available to provide information on Covered California Premium Assistance and with re-certification for the Medi-Cal and Kaiser programs. For more information, call (562) 941-1575.

Parenting Classes - Classes designed to improve the relationships between a parent and youth. The 12-week course fosters a stronger parent-teen relationship by providing skills that help nurture a strong-willed adolescent. For more information, call (562) 777-0877.

Educational Programs



Computer Lab - The lab offers activities to enhance computer concepts, job readiness skills, résumé preparation, and internet access. PowerPoint, Excel, Access, and Word programs are available for use.

Microsoft Office Computer Class - This six-week class offers an introduction to Microsoft Office programs - Word, Excel, Access, PowerPoint, Outlook, and the internet.

Computer Literacy Workshops

Basic Computer Function Workshops - These workshops cover five different topics to teach beginners basic computer features and functions.

English as a Second Language (ESL) Workshops - These workshops are offered to practice English skills using computer software.

Basic Keyboard Workshops - These workshops provide instruction on basic keyboard functions, typing skills, and drills to increase speed using computer software.

Health Programs

Chiropractic Services - Southern California University of Health Sciences' Los Angeles College of Chiropractic provides chiropractic examinations and adjustments by interns under the supervision of clinical faculty. To make an appointment, call (562) 946-2425.

John Wesley Health Center - The onsite clinic offers medical care, physical exams, routine screenings, and treatment of illness to women, children, and men. Health services are provided regardless of an individual's ability to pay at no, low, or sliding-scale costs contingent on the program requirements and available funds. Heart Education, Awareness, Readiness Training (HEART) Program - A five-week program that provides activities and information to reduce or eliminate risk behaviors and aid in the prevention and management of chronic illness. To register for the program, call (562) 946-2425.

Homework Assistance Program - An after-school homework assistance program for students, 1st to 5th grade. An enrollment application must be submitted for approval of eligibility. For more information, call (562) 946-2425.
