When a woman goes to prison, her kids serve time, too. Therefore, the healing process must be inclusive of her entire family.





About us

After the tragic death of her 5-year-old son, Susan Burton didn't have access to resources to help her address her grief. In despair, she turned to drugs and alcohol, which led to a cycle of incarceration that lasted nearly two decades. After finding help in an affluent area of Los Angeles, Susan dedicated her life to helping others heal. She founded ANWOL in 1998 to transform the lives of formerly incarcerated individuals and bring resources to the neighborhoods that need them the most.

More than 1,000 women and children have found safety in ANWOL's homes.

Our approach

Ending mass incarceration requires a multi-faceted approach.

 Housing: Women stay at ANWOL for as long as needed to build a strong foundation for independence.



- Legal: Our legal staff helps hundreds of people clean up their records each year.
- Policy: We actively seek structural changes by sponsoring legislation and partnering with local organizations and government entities.
- Leadership: We help the formerly incarcerated become change agents through groups like Women Organizing for Justice and Opportunity & All of Us or None.
