Foster Hope (South LA) - Foster Hope provides mail, free Wi-Fi, computers, basic need services (food, diapers, and clothing), financial assistance, housing referrals, service referrals, transportation, system navigation, charging stations, and employment and education opportunities.

Time Limited Subsidies (South LA/South Bay) – Time Limited Subsidies assist expectant and parenting youth, trafficking survivors, and young adults who are at-risk of or who are already experiencing homelessness to reintegrate in the community through short or medium-term rental assistance to secure housing.

College I Can – (South LA/South Bay/Antelope Valley) - College I Can provides college preparation, access, and retention services through its 'College I Can' Academies and drop-in services for low-income youth and families. Youth receive scholarships, financial aid counseling, housing assistance, academic counseling, mentoring, and tutoring.

Hope Connections (South Bay) - Hope Connections provides problem-solving, prevention, access center, and system services and support linkages for youth and young adults in crisis. Additionally, Hope Connections offers 20 beds of transitional housing in scattered-site apartments in Inglewood and Hawthorne for youth, ages 18-24, up to 24 months.

Hope Link (South LA) - Hope Link provides 12 beds of short-term bridge housing up to 90 days for young people, ages 18 - 22, while they seek and secure alternative housing. Hope Link also provides 17 beds of transitional housing for youth and young adults, ages 18-24, up to 24 months.

Family Connect – Connect LA (South LA) - Family Connect helps youth, ages 16-25, who are in or left strained family or household situations connect with their families by strengthening the family unit through family therapy, life coaching, financial assistance, and conflict resolution.

Young Parent Resiliency (YPR) (South LA) – YPR provides support groups, resource navigation, workforce development, and empowerment activities for expectant and parenting young people ages 16 and above.

Prevention/Diversion (South LA) – Prevention and Diversion provides juvenile justice prevention and diversion services, such as mentorship, counseling, advocacy, therapy, leadership-building, education support, and basic services to young people ages 15-above.

Destinations -Destinations is a character and leadership development program designed around national and international travel to expose young people, ages 18 -25, to racial justice and intersectional experiences and inspire lifelong learning and personal growth.
