



ORAL HEALTH CARE FOR PEOPLE LIVING WITH HIV/AIDS

Access to oral health care for people living with HIV/AIDS (PLWHA) remains a critical — and unmet — goal. The UCLA School of Dentistry has been awarded Ryan White funding to help meet these needs and provide comprehensive dental care at no cost to the patient.

Patients will receive diagnostic services such as exams and radiographs; preparatory work such as cleanings and removal of tooth decay; and restorative care including extractions, fillings, crowns and other prostheses, and periodontal surgery. There will also be an emphasis on prevention and early detection of oral diseases by periodic oral cancer screenings and teaching patients about the importance of proper oral care.

Patients must meet certain eligibility requirements including:

- Residency in Los Angeles County;
- Confirmed HIV infection;
- Income below 500% of federal poverty level; and
- No other funding source for services.
